had arrived during a 'male-bonding' time, where the men displayed their skills with firearms.

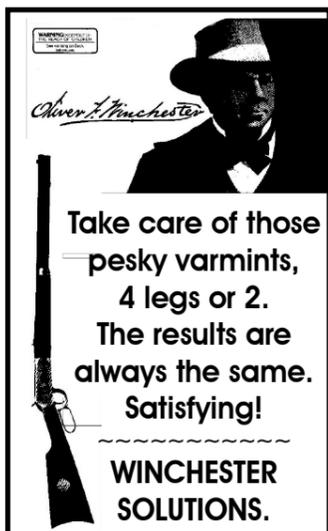
Dunmore was amazed to find some of the 'new-fangled' firearms that the Snake Gully citizens are famous for.
