but police believe they have a good idea after studying news camera footage.


The semi driver was clearly seen 'flipping' Mr. Rabbit's car as he sped by.

BREAKING NEWS: Opposition leader Tony Abbott has narrowly escaped a collision with a truck as he arrived to inspect a segment of Victoria's Princes Highway this morning.

As Mr Abbott's car slowed to turn into a property beside the highway, a van pulled out from behind his vehicle into the path of a truck.

The truck driver narrowly managed to stop his vehicle jack-knifing in the dirt beside the road as stunned journalists and local politicians watched on.

The truck was about five metres away from colliding with the van and Abbott's car.

The truck wobbled on its wheels and at one stage came close to toppling.

Mr Abbott was shaken by the near miss when talking to the press minutes later.

“We just saw a moment ago how perilous this road can be,” he said.

“You can never entirely eliminate danger on the roads but the better the roads are, the less hazard there is to traffic.

“I was probably a bit lucky in that I only saw it after it had kind of finished.

“I've got to say, the driver did a great job in keeping his vehicle upright.

“I'm very pleased and relieved no-one was hurt.”

“We look at these two-lane country highways and we feel safe on them but you are only ever a moment away from disaster.”
