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NEW GUNS TO BE ISSUED TO NSW POLICE

DRASTIC CUTS AS NSW DETECTIVES FIND THEIR UNITS ALMOST BANKRUPT

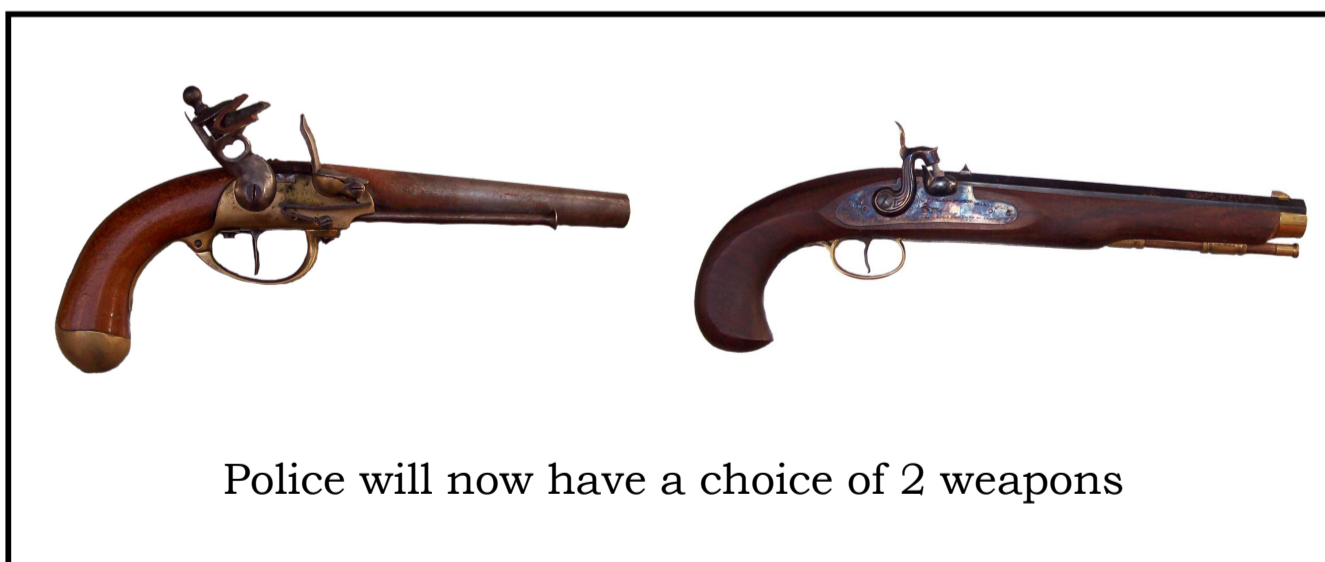

The NSW Police minister, Michael "Gunna" Costyu, today admitted that the NSW police force was suffering a financial dilemma and drastic step had to be taken immediately to alleviate the problem. "We are taking positive steps immediately", Mr Costyu said today.

"The starting point will be the re-arming of all NSW police officers with new pistols and the selling off of the self loading Glock pistol".

The new replacement pistols are believed to be far more efficient in ammunition supply and have less working parts than the recently introduced Glocks.

"There will be 2 models that officers will have a choice between" Mr. Costyu said.
